NB: Modifications to the approved Schedule can be accepted until two weeks prior to the Event, provided the closing date for Entries has not already passed; if the closing date for Entries has already passed, the FEI reserves the right to not approve the requested change. Additionally, no change may be made to a Longines Ranking Competition after the fifth Monday prior to the week of the Event. Prizes in kind, to be accepted as prize money to count for Longines Ranking competitions and total event prize money, must be easily convertible into cash (GRs Art. 127).

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III. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

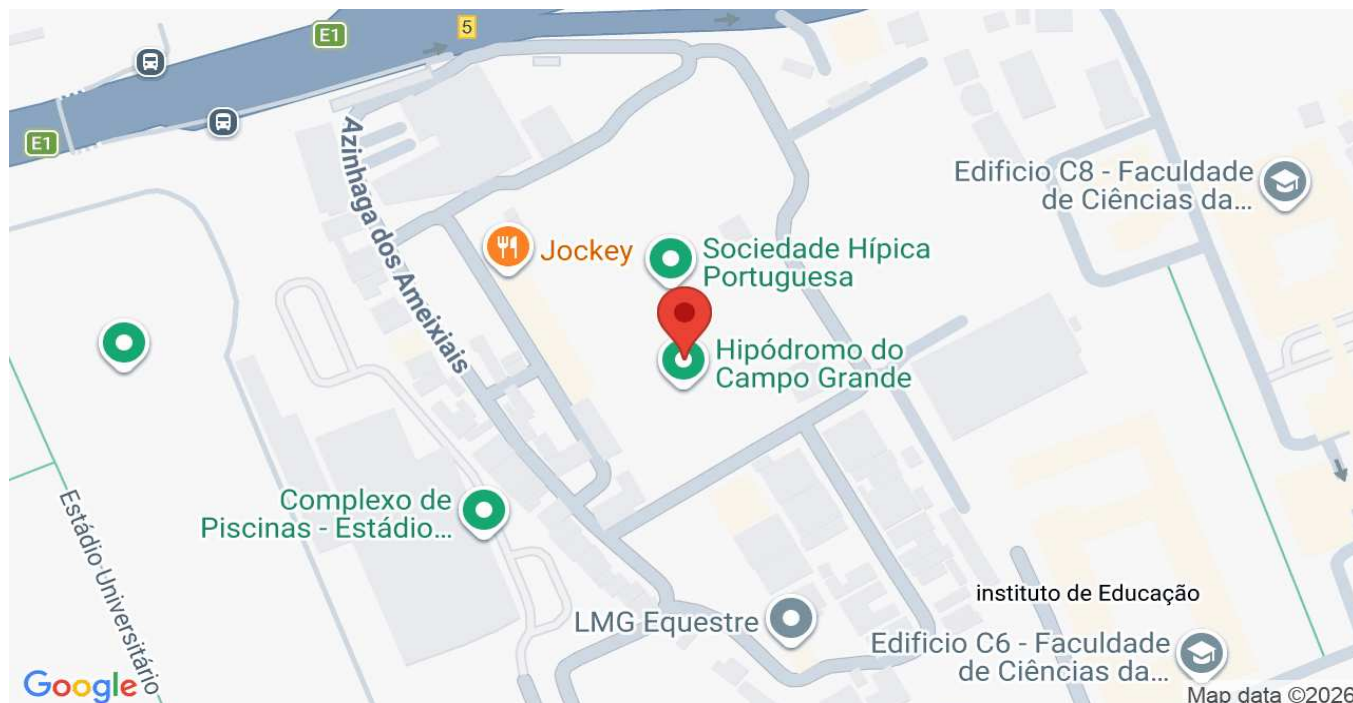

- Horses may take part in national Events up to two hours prior to the start of the international Event's Horse Inspection;
- If the national Event includes Competitions after the international Event ends, either on the same day or on the following day(s), horses having taken part in the international Event may take part in national Competitions only, following the conclusion of the international Event.

An adequate number of stables must be at least 4m x 3m to accommodate the larger Horses.

The time and date of arrival of athletes, horses and their means of transport must be given to the Organiser in order to facilitate their arrival.

Lorry parking must be booked with Definite Entries, specifying: electricity needs, number of horses traveling in the truck (and riders' names), if grooms are staying on the truck during the night.

We encourage everyone to optimize as much as possible the transports to be environmentally friendly.

ALLOWED HORSES' ARRIVAL TIMES:

Wednesday from 09:00 to 20:00

Thursday from 08:00 to 11:00 (2 hours before Vet Inspection)

Out of this time scheduled no entries of horse transports will be allowed.

Horses may not be unloaded on their arrival without the authorization of the Stable Manager and Veterinary Delegate.

There will be a veterinary protocol established in order to control all the horses. FEI EHV-1 Protocol will be strictly followed.

It's mandatory to follow the O.C., Stewards and Veterinarian's instructions.

- Horses will be stabled in permanent boxes
- Stables will be allocated in advance, PLEASE MAKE SPECIAL REQUESTS (e.g. stallions, corner box) with definite entries. Only assigned stables can be used.
- All horses will be bedded on shavings unless specifically requested otherwise with definite entries.
- Athletes and grooms should have the necessary equipment to contain difficult horses. No stallions board available.
- Stables must be mucked out daily and dirty bedding and rubbish placed in the special places.

- Further supplies will be provided daily according to instructions, times and prices available on arrival. The accounts for these purchases will be added to the final Athletes' account.
- Horses must be stabled within the FEI stable area for the duration of the event.
- Horses must be stabled in the boxes assigned to them on the show ground.
- Horses may not leave their boxes without the official show starting number.
- It is strictly forbidden to smoke in the stables areas. In case of reoccurrence the badge could be retired and the access to the stables areas prohibited.
- **DOGS ARE ONLY ALLOWED IN THE STABLES AREA ON LEASH AT ALL TIMES. FINE OF 100€ CHARGED IF IT'S NOT RESPECTED**
- It is completely forbidden to open/create illegal accesses to/from the FEI Stables. The badge could be retired and the access to the stables areas prohibited.
- The stables will be closed between 23:30 pm and 06:30 am. No horse may leave the stable area without the specific authorization of the Chief Steward unless there is an emergency.

WE KINDLY INVITE ALL ATHLETES AND PARTICIPANTS TO INFORM THEMSELVES AND STRICTLY ADHERE TO WHAT ESTABLISHED BY the FEI EHV-1 BY-LAWS FOR EHV-1 HORSES HERPES:

The EHV-1 By-Laws, which have been in place since 31 May 2021, protect FEI horses and global equestrian sports from the transmission of infectious diseases before, during and after FEI Events.

In accordance with the EHV-1 By-Law No.10, it is necessary to provide a signed Horse Health FEI Self-Certification form for all horses attending an FEI Event in mainland Europe, including mandatory temperature monitoring for the 3 days leading up to their arrival at an FEI Event.

As of 1 August 2021 this information must be submitted via the FEI HorseApp for all Events taking place in mainland Europe. The updated version of the FEI HorseApp will allow for

- Managing and overseeing multiple Horses.
- Reporting on a Horse's temperature twice a day.
- Filling in the Horse Health FEI Self-Certification form
- Uploading all the required information on the go and from a mobile application. Paper copies of the required documentation will no longer be accepted. Guidelines on how to use the new functionalities on the FEI HorseApp can be found EHV-1 BY-LAWS and general information regarding the FEI HorseApp can be found on Inside.FEI.org. 10. ADVERTISING ON ATHLETES AND HORSES

At CSI events, and all competitions except for the Nations Cup, athletes are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor in accordance with the article 207.2.6 of the FEI Jumping Rules.

The Chief Steward will check that the advertising on athletes and horses complies with these Articles.

No motorised vehicles (golf cars, motorbikes, electric scooter, etc) other than the OC's own vehicles, except wheelchair accessible vehicles, will be allowed on the venue. Bicycles will be permitted but not allowed in the stable area.

Entry rights to the stable area will be granted according to FEI Veterinary Regulations Articles 1008-1009.

An accreditation form will be send to the athletes 2 weeks prior the event. It has to be fulfilled and returned to the O.C. on time in order to generate the corresponding accreditations that will be send by SMS.

All riders, grooms, owners and partners must go to the Accreditation Office in order to get their Accreditations as they arrive to the venue. All participants must check in at the Show Office upon arrival.

Accreditations are nominative and non-transferrable in order to guarantee the security control at the FEI Stables and in all over the site. In case this is not respected, the accreditation will be withdrawn immediately to the owner and to other persons involved.

Additional accreditation can be purchased upon approval by the OC for 150 €. This charge will also apply to accreditation lost or stolen that is replaced.

Online Accreditation Procedure

All accreditations must be requested online via the official accreditation form of the OC, respecting deadlines. Late applications may not be guaranteed accreditation.

Notes:

- Transportation with shuttle and bus service is guaranteed for the above mentioned accredited people
- A valid ID document (passport or national ID) must be presented upon collection. No accreditations will be handed out without proper identification.
- During the online pre-registration process, individuals may be provisionally accepted as Horse Owners. However, any on-site spare passes for Horse Owners will only be granted to individuals whose personal name is explicitly listed as the registered owner of a horse competing at the event on data.fei.org. Company representatives who have not been previously declared as owners will not be accepted.
- Upon arrival at the venue, all official Veterinarians must announce their presence at the office in the veterinary area and

provide the Veterinary Centre with a completed PTV Event Registration Form. All veterinarians must conduct themselves during the event in compliance with the current FEI Veterinary Regulations and other FEI relevant Rules and Regulations. All Veterinarians requiring stables accreditation must be in possession of an FEI Permitted Treating Veterinarian card. Accreditation for veterinarians will be withdrawn for failure to register in this way.

- Permitted Equine therapist have to register themselves with the VC/VD on arrival (Vet Reg. Art. 1125)

IX. TIMETABLE

As per Jumping Rules Annex VI: combined competitions are not permitted.

The scheduling of competitions must take into account mandatory maintenance breaks as follows. In principle, there should be one maintenance break for every 40 starters; at a minimum, it is compulsory to include one maintenance break in competitions with 50-99 starters after half of the starters have competed. Competitions with 100 starters or more must have three maintenance breaks. The start list must indicate when the maintenance break will take place (e.g. after N° 25).

All horses taking part at this Event must be present during the first horse inspection, unless unable to do so due to "force majeure".

Competitions must not start before 08:00 h and must not finish after 23:00 h, unless prior approval is granted by the FEI.

The tax form must be provided to the athletes upon arrival and returned to the OC prior to departing together with the applicable tax documents according to the jurisdiction of residence.

Applicable Portuguese income tax to be deducted from Prize Money

In accordance with the Portuguese Tax legislation the prize money in sporting competitions is subject to withholding at source of income tax according to the following regulations:

Tax Resident Riders in Portugal

- Individuals with "Green receipt": retention of 25% is made on the amount paid
- Invoiced by "Companies": no retention is made.
- Without Documents: definitive retention of 25% is made on the amount paid

Non Tax Resident Riders

In general withholding retention of 25% is made on the amount paid.

If an invoice or receipt is not presented, the rider must present NIF (EU residents) or Passport (other countries) of the country of origin.

Exceptions

For "Companies" withholding may be avoided in case a Tax Treaty between Portugal and the country where the beneficiary is tax resident is in force allowing such exemption. For such purpose certain documents must be provided by the interested party, namely the proof of tax residence issued by the Tax Authority of the concerned jurisdiction and the applicable document model.

Note

Any payment to an individual or legal entity resident in a tax heaven jurisdiction as such qualified in the list published from time to time by the Portuguese Government is subject to 35% withholding tax.

Due to the existence of different taxations, the prize values presented will be the gross value, before taxation.

The payment of the Prize Money will be conditioned by the presentation of the following documents:

- Receipt or document accepted by the Fiscal Administration or Identification Card or Passport and the Fiscal Identification
- Tax Number (VAT ID when applicable) of the respective country

The payment will only be made after the Organizing entity has received these documents

Applicable VAT Payment

VAT at the rate of 23% is generally applicable to: any amount paid to Portuguese tax residents, to non Portuguese tax residents who are not registered for VAT and to residents in tax heaven jurisdictions.

Exceptions

Residents in EU jurisdictions who are registered for VAT in their country of origin and invoice the Portuguese prize paying entity accordingly, will not be charged for Portuguese VAT and are subject to auto liquidation in their own country of residence.

5. INJURY SURVEILLANCE

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VIII:

Horses participating in FEI Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; and in the event of fatality, a post mortem examination.

6. TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in suitable vehicles for the transport of horses. Any government requirements for infectious disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, to ensure that the horse is in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have the responsibility to comply with national legislation in both their country of origin and the host nation of the Event. Where necessary athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation.

7. VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE

7.1 PASSPORTS (FEI GENERAL REGULATIONS ART. 137)

For all issues reFlating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation.

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events.

NB: Horses entered in CIMs and in CSIP in their country of residence are not required to have an FEI Passport or FEI Recognition Card but must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable (FEI General Regulations, Art. 137.2).

Athletes who do not present a Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card, or one that is not correctly validated or fail to meet other passport requirements will be **subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex VI of the FEI Veterinary Regulations** and may not be allowed to compete.

NB for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union: all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

7.2 VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ART. 1003)

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations.

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these Veterinary Regulations. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.

7.3 EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ART. 1029)

On arrival at an Event venue, all Horses must undergo an examination by an FEI veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip (where present), their vaccination status and met the FEI's health requirements to access the FEI Stables Area. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, infectious disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue. PRs must fulfil the Horse Health Requirements via the FEI HorseApp in advance of the event which will be checked at the Examination on Arrival.

7.4 HORSE INSPECTIONS (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLES 1032-1040)

All Horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

7.5 LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS, ART. 1046-1051 AND ANNEX VIII)

Horses may be subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of an Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event. Horses may be selected for examination under the protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination or are subject to immediate disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

8. EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP)

8.1 SAMPLING (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS CHAPTER VII)

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures. Refer to FEI Financial Charges for details of fees relating to Equine and Human Anti-Doping program (EADCMP), which OCs/NFs have the right to charge to the athlete (applicable for all FEI events worldwide).

8.2 ELECTIVE TESTING (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ARTICLES 1056)

Elective Testing may be carried out prior to an Event to check for the presence of prohibited substances. Please refer to <https://inside.fei.org/fei/cleansport/horses> for information and details.

XIII. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

Athletes can be tested at any FEI Event, by the FEI or by other Anti-Doping Organisations with Testing jurisdiction. Organisers will have the responsibility to provide facilities and staff/volunteers to facilitate such Testing if requested by the FEI as outlined in article 22.3 of the FEIs' Anti-doping Rules for Human Athletes (ADRHA).

The ADRHA rules are published on the FEI's website at <http://inside.fei.org/content/anti-doping-rules>.

XIV. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. INSURANCES AND NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risks. To the greatest extent permitted by law, the FEI and the FEI Event Organiser shall NOT be liable for any damages relating to loss of property or injury of any kind to Athletes, Owners, Support Personnel or Horses at or in connection with an FEI Event and the FEI expressly excludes all such liability.

1.1 ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

1.1.1 Personal accident and health insurance

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/ Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at FEI Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at a FEI Event.

You should check with your National Federation to confirm if your National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses which may occur when you are attending/participating in FEI Events.

If your National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at FEI Events.

1.1.2 Personal property insurance

You should also ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage, which may occur at an FEI Event.

Again, the advice is to check with your National Federation to confirm if they have an insurance policy in place, which would cover you in case of such property loss, theft or damage. If not, then you should obtain your own personal property insurance to cover such situations.

1.1.3 Press equipment

Press equipment and other items left in the Press workroom, Press lockers, the Press Tribune or anywhere on the showgrounds are left entirely at the owner's risk. The Organising Committee does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to such equipment or items. Members of the Press are advised not to leave any equipment or personal items unattended.

1.2 ATHLETES AND OWNERS

1.2.1 Third party liability insurance

As an Athlete/Owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses. You are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to FEI Events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The FEI and the Organiser will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses.

1.2.2 Additional liability information

Neither the OC, nor the Shipping Agent accepts any responsibility for any accident or illness that may befall any horse, competitor, groom or any other person. The same applies in case of damage to cars, saddler, utensils and all other object (including damage resulting from theft, loss, fire).

NF's/riders are responsible to ensure that each participating horse is insured for a sufficient amount to cover any eventuality that can occur during or in relation to the event, including without limitations, problems during the transportation to and from the venue.

Transport and travel Insurance (including flight insurance) for horses, riders and grooms: riders are responsible for arranging their own travel and transport insurance. The event organizer strongly advise all riders take care of travel and transport insurance for the rider, groom, and horse(s).

Medical insurance for riders and grooms: riders and grooms are responsible for arranging their own medical insurance. The event organizer strongly advise all riders take care of medical insurance for the rider, groom and horses.

1.2.3 Horse insurance

As an Owner you should ensure that your Horses are adequately insured against any injuries or illnesses they may sustain while participating at a FEI Event.

Neither the OC, nor the Shipping Agent accepts any responsibility for any accident or illness that may befall any horse, competitor, groom or any other person. The same applies in case of damage to cars, saddler, utensils and all other object (including damage resulting from theft, loss, fire). NF's/riders are responsible to ensure that each participating horse is insured for a sufficient amount to cover any eventuality that can occur during or in relation to the event, including without limitations, problems during the transportation to and from the venue.

Transport and travel Insurance (including flight insurance) for horses, riders and grooms: riders are responsible for arranging their own travel and transport insurance. The event organizer strongly advise all riders take care of travel and transport insurance for the rider, groom, and horse(s).

2. PROTESTS / APPEALS

To be valid, all Protests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent, as mentioned in the FEI General Regulations (Art. 161-162) available at the following link:

3. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Athletes wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These athletes will start first in these competitions.

4. STEWARDING

- If an athlete is uncertain as to whether the boots they intends to use during an event are allowed, they or their representative should show the boots to the Chief Steward for their opinion before the boots are used in training or in competition.
- In addition, athletes are to be made aware that hind boots must be removed and placed again on the horse's legs in the presence of a Steward while in the warm-up arena prior to entering the competition arena for certain competitions. (If bandages are used in place of boots, athletes are not required to remove the bandages in the warm-up arena.) This procedure is compulsory for competitions for which boot and bandage control is mandatory, that is the Nations Cup, Grand Prix, and the competition with the highest prize money, and is at the discretion of the Chief Steward for other competitions.
- As an alternative to carrying out this procedure at the time designated by the Steward an athlete may ask their groom to take the boots to the in-gate and place them on the horse's legs in front of the Steward prior to the combination entering the arena.
- The Steward has the authority to intervene if a boot is deemed excessively tight by instructing that the boot be removed and put on again correctly. [Stewards are to note that it is normal for a horse's gait to be somewhat affected immediately after boots have been removed and re-placed.] If an athlete or his/her groom refuses to remove and re- place the boot(s) when instructed to do so by the Steward, a Yellow Warning Card will be issued to the athlete in question.
- If it is deemed impossible or unsafe to remove the hind boots in the warm-up arena prior to the combination entering the competition arena, due to an extremely excited or nervous horse, the boots of the horse in question are to be removed by the athlete/groom following the athlete's round upon leaving the arena and inspected by the Steward. This inspection may be carried out during the boot and bandage control if the boot and bandage control is carried out for the competition in question.
- This procedure does not replace boot and bandage control after completion of an athlete's round for competitions for which boot and bandage control is mandatory (refer to JRs Art. 266).

5. DISPUTES

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

6. MODIFICATION TO SCHEDULE

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe, host NF delegate, if any, and the Ground Jury, the Organiser may change the schedule in order to clarify any matter arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the Technical Delegate, the President of the Ground Jury or the Foreign Judge, as applicable.

7. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FROM THE ORGANISER

DOGS: Please note that dogs are permitted only at the stables area, but on a leash at all times. Fine of 100€ charged if it is not respected.

It is strictly forbidden to smoke in the stables areas. In case of reoccurrence the badge could be retired and the access to the stables areas prohibited.

We have to ask you to help us enforce our smoking rules. Smoking in the stables is strictly forbidden! Please help us enforce this rule by informing your grooms.

Accreditations are nominative and non-transferrable in order to guarantee the security control at the FEI Stables and in all over the site. In case this is not respected, the accreditation will be withdrawn immediately to the owner and to other persons involved.

Veterinary and medical assistance, as well as farriery services, are available for the duration of the event. These are at the expense of those requesting them.

Competitors and others involved in the event must make themselves conversant with this official schedule's content, in addition to the special conditions applicable to the various competitions.

Athletes may only compete on the understanding that they comply with and are bound by these regulations and the special conditions relating to each competition. By entering a horse into the event, the Person Responsible fully accepts the conditions of the official schedule and of the program itself, applicable to the athletes, grooms, horse owners and the horses.

In the event of a cancellation of a competition due to a force majeure event (such as extreme weather conditions, pandemic, etc) and provided the cancelled competition(s) cannot be rescheduled at the Event, there will be no ranking points, no standing/classification, and no Minimum Eligibility Requirements for said competitions. In addition, the Organiser has no obligation to pay the prize-money (or a portion of it) for a cancelled competition.

Authorization for the Use of Images

By entering and participating in the competition, the athlete expressly consents to being photographed and recorded on video during the event. These images and videos will be the exclusive property of the event organization and may be used, both online and offline, for promotional, commercial, informational and/or other purposes indefinitely. The athlete waives any right to receive financial compensation for the use of these images.

Copyright Notice

All images and videos captured during the event are protected by copyright and are the exclusive property of the event organization. Any unauthorized use of these images and videos, without the prior written consent of the organization, is strictly prohibited.

In case of a tie for the 13th place in a competition with 13 to 48 starters, the prize money foreseen for the 13th place will be divided equally among the athletes concerned.

For Competitions run in two rounds with more than 13 starters in 2nd round:

OCs that indicate in the schedule that a specific number (that is more than 13) of athletes will return for the second round will be permitted to distribute the prize money for that competition among all the athletes taking part in the second round, even if the second round is followed by a jump-off in case of a tie on penalties for first place after the second round.

DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY AT COMPETITIONS

Full details of any deductions from prize money must be outlined in the schedule. This includes government taxes. If it is necessary for Organisers to deduct such taxes, they must provide participants with an official form indicating the amount of tax deducted.

The tax form must be provided to the athletes upon arrival and returned to the Organiser prior to departing.

IMPORTANT

The total amount of prize money shown for each Competition in the schedule must be distributed. (FEI General Regulations articles 127 and 128)

For details of the prize money breakdown for each competition please refer to the tables at the end of this document; the Organiser must specify which of the two (2) tables will be used. The total prize money for the Competition must be distributed among the first thirteen (13) placed athletes.

The Organiser must provide additional created prizes for athletes placed beyond thirteen (13th) place. The minimum amount for each of these additional prizes, for athletes placed from fourteenth (14th) to last place, must be clearly specified in the approved schedule and not exceed the prize money of the athlete placed thirteen (13th)

Each athlete is obliged to forward the prize-money as well as any reimbursement to the respective horse owner.

Each athlete is requested to check and sign the final account at the accounting office before departure. The horse passports will only be handed out after the accounts have been settled. The tax form must be provided to the athletes upon arrival and returned to the OC prior to departing.

9. MAXIMUM NUMBER OF STARTERS PER COMPETITION

***Annex II FEI Jumping Rules:**

Maximum 100 starters per Competition other than the GP. If more than 100 starters are declared, the OC must split the competition into the number of groups required to ensure that there are no more than 100 starters in any group, and provide the same amount of prize money as indicated

The additional prize money provided by the OC is not taken into consideration with regard to the overall prize money that determines the star level of the Event or the Longines Ranking point group of the Competition, if applicable.

OCs may apply either of the following methods for splitting the Competition:

- The competition is split into the number of groups required before it starts. There may be athletes with multiple horses in each group but all horses of any one athlete must be in the same group. If it is not possible to have groups of equal size there may be a different number of starters in each group;
- The competition is run as one single competition and split afterward into the number of groups required to ensure that there are no more than 100 starters in any group, and the classification established as follows: the athlete with the best score is the winner of the first group, the athlete with the second best score is the winner of the second group and so on until prizes

have been allocated to 25% of the total number of starters. NB: In this case separate results must be sent to the FEI for each of the groups, e.g. results for Competition 1a and for Competition 1b (and for Competition 1c if the original Competition was split into three groups, etc).

In both cases above each group must offer the same amount of prize money as indicated for the original Competition. For the avoidance of doubt, it is the number of declared starters in the Competition, not the final number of starters that determines whether the Competition must be split.

As all FEI World Cup™ Competitions have the status of a Grand Prix, the minimum prize money requirements for the Grand Prix are applicable to the World Cup™ Competition.

For CSI-W Events with a Grand Prix Competition in addition to the FEI World Cup™ Competition, the minimum prize money requirements indicated for the Grand Prix apply only to the FEI World Cup™ Competition; the Grand Prix Competition at such Events cannot offer more prize money than the prize money offered for the FEI World Cup™ Competition.

10. LIST OF APPROVED FEES
